



### MN Native Plants

⊕ ● **Arrowhead, Broadleaf** *Sagittaria latifolia*  
Small white flowers in spring. Grown for large arrowhead-shaped leaves. Edible tuber. 18-24" h  
**4" pot \$4**

○ ⊕ **Blazing Star, Marsh** *Liatris spicata* Erect spike of rose-purple flower heads bloom from the top down in a feathery display. Grass-like leaves are clumped toward the base of the plant, but extend up the stem to the showy flower cluster. 3-4' h **4" pot \$4**

NEW

○ ⊕ **Blazing Star, Prairie** *Liatris pycnostachya*  
Iconic prairie flower with a spectacular spike of tightly bunched lavender flowers blooming at the top and working their way down the single stem. Grows well in both moist soils and in clay. 3-5' h  
**4" pot \$4**

NEW

○ ⊕ **Blue Vervain** *Verbena hastata* Moisture-loving plant typically found in moist meadows and along streams. The deep blue-violet flower spikes are a highlight of the midsummer meadow, and remain blooming for up to 2 months. Individual plants are biennial, but may colonize slowly by rhizomes from the fibrous root system. Standing water is not tolerated but okay for short periods like a rain garden. 3-6' h **4" pot \$4**

○ ⊕ ● **Blue-Eyed Grass, Stout** *Sisyrinchium angustifolium* Dense clumps that resemble grass but a member of the iris family with blue flowers and yellow centers. Moisture loving, but needs well-drained soil and does well in light shade. 6-12" h **4" pot \$4**

NEW

○ ⊕ ● **Bog Bean** *Menyanthes trifoliata* Three-lobed leaves grow from a rhizome along the water's surface. Trailing roots good for fish spawn. Height: surface-6" **bareroot \$2-4**

⊕ ● **Calla Lily** *Calla pallustris* Native to bogs, marshes, pond peripheries, and swamps. Best grown in acidic, humus-rich, muddy (moist to wet) soils in part shade. Will grow with water up to 2" above crown. From the center of the broad shiny leaf stalks rises a single white flower in late spring on a stout stem. 4-12" h **4" pot \$4**

○ ⊕ **Cardinal Flower** *Lobelia cardinalis* Bright red tubular flowers Jul-Sep. 24-48" **4" pot \$4, jumbo pot \$10**

⊕ ● **Coneflower, Cutleaf** *Rudbeckia lanciniata*  
Not many woodland flowers will reach the height of this coneflower. Its bright yellow flowers and relatively late bloom time compared to many spring-blooming woodland flowers make it a wonderful addition to your woodland planting. Likes very moist to wet soil. 5-7' h **4" pot \$3, jumbo pot \$7**

○ **Cup Plant** *Silphium perfoliatum* Huge showy plant with sunflower yellow flowers tolerant of clay and likes wet feet. Leaves surround distinctive square stem forming cup. 4-8' **jumbo pot \$5, #1 pot \$10**

○ ⊕ ● **Horsetail Rush** *Equisetum hyemale* Scouring rush for wet feet in pond or raingarden. Prehistoric look. **jumbo pot \$7**

○ ⊕ ● **Horsetail Rush, Dwarf** *Equisetum scirpoides* Darling miniature horsetail with fine segmented foliage. For containers, fairy gardens, edge of pond or stream. **3.5" pot \$5**

○ ⊕ **Fireweed** *Epilobium angustifolium* Robust strongly-spreading, wildflower with mostly unbranched, stiff woody stems clad with dark green willow-like leaves. Stalks are topped by an elongated show of bright pink to lilac-purple flowers. Needs regular moisture, but will not tolerate standing water. Great for the raingarden. 2-5' h **4" pot \$4**

○ ⊕ **Iris, Blue Flag** *Iris Versicolor* Beautiful periwinkle blue iris for shallow water or raingarden. **4" pot \$4 jumbo pot \$10**

○ ⊕ **Ironweed, Common** *Veronia fasciculata* Intense purple blooms stand out in the late summer landscape, attracting many butterflies and other pollinators. Tolerates moist soil with brief flooding making it great for the raingarden. Plant height may be reduced easily by cutting-back the stems in late spring, giving a better show of flowers too. Self seeds. 4-6' **4" pot \$4**

⊕ ● **Jewelweed** *Impatiens capensis* Annual tall impatiens for wet feet. Speckled orange blossoms in full shade. Self seeds. 36-48" h **4" pot \$3**

○ ⊕ **Joe Pye Weed** *Eupatorium maculatum* Irresistible to butterflies. Crowned with clusters of bright pink flowers in late summer this Joe Pye Weed is typically around six feet tall. Perfect for planting in any damp areas, drainage areas, along streambanks, and on pond edges. 4-6' h **4" pot \$4, jumbo pot \$10**

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**Lizard's Tail** *Saururus cernuus* Many tiny, fragrant, white flowers are on a slender, tapering, stalked spike with a drooping tip (the lizard's tail) upon a tall plant with heart-shaped slightly fuzzy alternating leaves. One of the few things that bloom in a shady pond, can tolerate crowns up to 4" below water. 3-4'h **2" pot \$4**
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**Lobelia, Great Blue** *Lobelia siphilitica* Grows in moist to wet locations along streams, swamps, meadows and in low wooded areas. A clump-forming perennial with blue, tubular flowers on a dense raceme blooming in late summer. 2-3'h **4" pot \$4**
- **Mallow, Rose** *Hibiscus laevis* Our only native hibiscus! Large, 5-petaled, hollyhock-like flowers (to 6" diameter) with white to pink petals and maroon eyes appear from mid-summer into fall on smooth stout stems. Late to leaf out in spring, so be patient. Grows well in garden soil, but can tolerate periods below water. 4-6'h **4" pot \$4, jumbo pot \$10**
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**Mare's Tail** *Hippuris vulgaris* Soft bottle-brush stems rise above shallow water. Native look-alike for parrot's feather. 6-12" **jumbo pot \$10**
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**Marsh Marigold** *Caltha palustris* First to bloom in spring. Bog charmer with cup-shaped yellow flowers 6-10"h **4" pot \$4, jumbo pot \$15, #1 pot \$20**
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**Meadow Rue, Purple** *Thalictrum dasycarpum* Tall, graceful plant found in a medium-wet prairie or savanna. The stems are distinctly purple and strong to hold up to high winds. Dainty yellow flowers form on large racemes in late spring. 4-6'h **4" pot \$4**
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**Milkweed, Showy** *Asclepias speciosa* Not as tolerant of wet feet as swamp milkweed, its pinkish-purple flowers are larger than that of common milkweed and it doesn't spread so rapidly. Great garden plant and good for pollinators. 3-4'h **4" pot \$4**
- **Milkweed, Swamp** *Asclepias incarnata* Deer-resistant plant grows best in moist but will tolerate average soils, and blooms for about a month mid-summer with rosy-pink flowers exuding a vanilla fragrance. 3-4'h **4" pot \$4**
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**Mistflower** *Eupatorium coelestinum* Purple-blue flowers form in clusters of 35-70 (like ageratum) at the tops of stems in late summer and autumn, like a "mist" of blue in dense colonies attracting late-season butterflies. Can be late to emerge in the spring, especially in northern climates so be patient. 18-24"h **4" pot \$4**
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**Monkey Flower, Lavender** *Mimulus ringens* Snapdragon-like purple flowers bloom along a central stem leader. Can be kept shorter, and have a second bloom if cut back in late June. Will tolerate regular garden soil or constantly wet feet of the pond edge. 36-48"h **4" pot \$3, jumbo pot \$5**
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**Obedient Plant** *Physostegia virginiana* A member of the mint family, so beware of the spreading rhizomes. Its "obedience" refers to its spray of purple tubular flowers staying put in the direction they are placed. Loving constantly moist soil of the pond edge, it also provides copious amounts of nectar in late summer into fall. 3-4'h **4" pot \$4**
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**Rush, Common** *Juncus effusus* Fantastic wetland plant that does well both in and out of the pond. Relatively small clumping rush of straight tubular leaves, with a flush of small flowers that appear from a slit at the top of the leaf, like a little bouquet. 18-24"h **4" pot \$4**
- **Rush, Pickerel** *Pontederia cordata* Long, glossy heart-shaped leaves with bluish-purple spikes of flowers. Tolerates water up to 4" over crown and needs constantly wet feet. 24-36"h **4" pot \$4, jumbo pot \$10**
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**Rush, Soft-stemmed Bulrush** *Scirpus atrovirens* Large blue-green tubular leaves make a statement at the edge of the pond. A great alternative to cattails that can become invasive in the pond. Excellent nesting site for waterfowl along the edge of the pond. Will take up to 1' deep water above its crowns. 4-5'h **jumbo pot \$5**
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**Sedge, Lake** *Carex lacustris* Large, clumping lakeshore sedge makes great protection for wildlife, and looks great too along the shoreline. 36-48"h **4" pot \$4, jumbo pot \$10**

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- NEW ○ **Sedge, Porcupine** *Carex hystericina* A fine-leaved sedge for wet soils and full sun. Clumps of drooping grass-like foliage are an important food source for wetland insects and waterfowl, and looks great along the shoreline or pond. 2-3'h **4" pot \$4**
- ⊕ **Sneezeweed** *Helenium autumnale* Host to the Dainty Sulphur Butterfly/caterpillar. Large and numerous bright yellow daisy-like flowers bloom in late summer and autumn when many flowers have faded. Pollen is not wind-driven, so doesn't affect allergy sufferers. Wet to medium-wet garden soil. 3-4'h **4" pot \$4**
- NEW ○ ⊕ **Sweetflag** *Acorus americanus* Strong upright iris-like leaves leave a sweet, cinnamon scent when crushed or cut and stay fully green all summer long. Tolerates garden soil and water 2" above crowns. 18-24"h **jumbo pot \$10**
- NEW ○ ⊕ **St John's Wort, Great** *Hypericum pyramidatum* Three weeks of abundant yellow blooms during July into August on this fairly large plant which likes moist wooded slopes and stream banks. Airy lobed leaves are somewhat deer and rabbit resistant. 5-6'h **4" pot \$4**
- ⊕ **Water Plantain** *Alisma triviale* A "hosta" for the water. Large rosette of glossy green hosta-like leaves sends up a large baby's breath-like flower stalk of tiny white flowers. A misty cloud in the summer distance. Likes shallow water, but tolerates moist garden soil too. 12" h leaves, 3'h flower spike. **4" pot \$4**

### Cold-Hardy Plants

- ⊕ ● **Angelica, Korean** *Angelica Gigas* Striking plant for moist woodland or bog. Blooms burgundy in fall up to a hard freeze. Most asked-about plant at the State Fair pond. 3-5' **4"pot \$3, jumbo pot \$7**
- ⊕ **Arrow Arum** *Peltandra virginica* Dense clump of arrowhead leaves. Reddish stems and calla-like flowers. 18-24" **4" pot \$4, jumbo pot \$10**
- NEW ⊕ **Arrowhead, 'Crushed Ice'** *Sagittaria graminea* 'Crushed ice' Narrow-leafed arrowhead with gorgeous creamy yellow stippled leaves. Same upright habit, and adorable white flowers in the spring as the parent. 18-24"h **4" pot \$6**

- NEW ⊕ **Arrowhead, Double** *Sagittaria japonica* The Asian arrowhead which produces much larger double-petaled flowers in the spring. Really lovely combination of large arrowhead lance shaped leaves with bright white pom-pom flowers on a raceme. 24-36"h **4" pot \$6** rated to zone 5
- ⊕ **Bloody Dock** *Rumex sanguineus* A biennial herb with the most spectacular foliage. From the Sorrel family, yes, it is edible. Deep red veins stand out amongst long green leaves forming a clump. This plant will grow well in regular garden soil and with water over its crown. **4" pot \$4**
- NEW ○ ⊕ **Cardinal Flower, Pink** *Lobelia x speciosa* 'Pink' Everything that you, butterflies and bees love about the native Cardinal flower is now available in a gorgeous deep pink version. For those who want a different pop of color, or if red clashes in your palette. Also, a short-lived perennial. 24-36"h **4" pot \$6**
- ⊕ **Cattail, Dwarf** *Typha minima* Due to an invasive problem with Narrow-leaf cattail hybridizing with our native Broad-leaf cattail, we are no longer offering the larger cattails for sale. But this darling is the true miniature standing only a foot tall with graceful grass-like foliage and a tiny little 1" cattail. Excellent for container gardens and along pond edges. 12-18"h **4" pot \$6**
- ⊕ **Chameleon Plant** *Houttuynia cordata* 'Chameleon' Grows like a variegated ivy through rhizomes. Variegation is dark blue-green with creamy white and pink tinges. More sun, more pink. Bright white flower bracts in late spring. Grows well in both garden soil and pond. 9-15"h **4" pot \$6**
- NEW ○ ⊕ **European Brooklime** *Veronica beccabunga* A spectacular creeper over the sides of containers, in streams, along the pond edge. Will form a mat of vegetation near pond edge that attracts frogs and other wildlife. Glossy green foliage stays all summer long, but the show is the tons of periwinkle-blue flowers in the spring. Roots along stem nodes, but very easy to remove if it gets to be too much. 4-8"h **3.5" pot \$3**
- **Iris, Louisiana 'Ann Chowning'** Vermillion red falls and standards with golden yellow signals. As with all Louisiana iris, grow in moist garden soil, along the pond edge (at water level) or in a rain garden. 36"h **2" pot \$5**

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### Cold-Hardy Plants

- **Iris, Louisiana 'Black Gamecock'** One of the best pond-performing iris with the deepest darkest purple flowers and yellow highlights blooming late spring to early summer. As with all Louisiana iris, grow in moist garden soil, along the pond edge (at water level) or in a raingarden. 36"h **4" pot \$6**

- **Iris, Louisiana 'Colorific'** Spectacular color all on one plant: Purple petals alternate with white with light lavender veins blooms in late spring. As with all Louisiana iris, grow in moist garden soil, along the pond edge (at water level) or in a raingarden. 30"h **2" pot \$5**

- **Iris, Louisiana 'Dixie Deb'** DeBaillon Award winner, vibrant sulphur-yellow flowers stand tall, and don't droop blooming early to mid-spring. As with all Louisiana iris, grow in moist garden soil, along the pond edge (at water level) or in a raingarden. 36"h **2" pot \$5**

- **Iris, Louisiana 'Red Velvet Elvis'** 2005 DeBaillon Award winner, who can resist the name? Well that, and it is a beautiful iris with ruby red falls with a dark yellow signal, and mauve standards blooming in late May. As with all Louisiana iris, grow in moist garden soil, along the pond edge (at water level) or in a raingarden. 36"h **2" pot \$5**

- **Iris, Louisiana x 'Wow Factor'** An interesting cross of Louisiana with Australian variety producing much larger lemon yellow and chocolate blended petals with cinnamon veins. Foliage also slightly larger than standard Louisiana species. 42"h **2" pot \$5**

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- ⊕ **Iris, Water Blue** *Iris laevigata* A true water-iris, this one needs constant moisture and will thrive even when crown is submerged an inch or two. Deepest royal-blue flowers with bright white streak through the middle is eye-catching. 2-3'h **4" pot \$4**

- ⊕ **Iris, Water 'Colchester'** *Iris laevigata colchesteri* Found in Europe, this one is impossible to find in the US, but we can't figure out why. Gorgeous white petals are mottled with dark purple-blue like fine paint splatters. A true water-iris, this needs constant moisture and will thrive even when crown is submerged an inch or two. 2-3'h **4" pot \$4, jumbo pot \$10**

- **Rush, Corkscrew** *Juncus effusus spiralis* A clump of curly-spirals make an unusual show reminding those of us with naturally curly hair of a "bad hair day". This charmer is a variant of the native common rush which grows well in moist to wet garden soil and along pond edge with crown submerged 1-2". 12-18"h **4" pot \$4**

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- ⊕ **Rush, Pickerel Pink** *Pontederia cordata 'Pink pons'* Same beautiful glossy green foliage as the native, but with pink instead of purple flower spikes. A great color addition to the marginal edges of the pond. 24-36"h **3.5" pot \$6, jumbo pot \$12**

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- ⊕● **Sedge, Bowles Golden** '*Carex elata Bowles Golden*' One of the most spectacularly performing clump grasses for light shade and wet feet. Bright chartreuse green foliage stands out in the darkest corner, stays neatly clumped all summer. One of Dr. Mary Meyer's favorite for damp places. This plant will do well in moist garden soil, raingardens and pond edges. Keep crown at or above water level. 1-2'h **4" pot \$4**

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- ⊕ **Sweetflag, Japanese Miniature** *Acorus gramineus 'Ogon'* Really adorable miniature sweetflag with same upright habit and light yellow-green variegation along its edges. Perfect for a container or pond edge. Will grow well in moist garden soil, raingarden or pond edge with crown submerged up to 1-2". 6-12"h **4" pot \$6 jumbo pot \$15**

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- ⊕ **Sweetflag, Variegated** *Acorus calamus variegata* A spectacular pond plant for beginners, this plant looks like an iris, with strong vertical variegation of creamy white against dark green on same leaf. Stays tall, and colorful all summer long. Can be grown directly in the gravel and in biofilters for great natural filtration. Leaves and stems emit sweet fragrance when crushed. Flowers are insignificant. 3-4'h **Bare Root Clumps \$2-\$7**

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- ⊕● **Water Forget-Me-Not** *Myosotis scorpioides* Just like the shade-loving garden plant, but this one thrives in wet feet and water, where the other would drown. Lovely periwinkle-blue flowers drape along the fuzzy green leaves, and has a tendency to rebloom later in the summer, especially if given a little trim. Makes an excellent container plant, or pond edge as it will drape over anything. Trailing 4-6'h **4" pot \$4**



### Lotus *Nelumbo nucifera*

All lotus are sold as bareroot tubers. Price depends on variety, number of growing eyes and storage capability (not size) of tuber. Large lotus will have larger tubers. In general, tubers costing \$15 or more should bloom in this calendar year, given proper planting and growing conditions. Planting instructions are included: typically, a round tub 18-24" in diameter less than 12" tall is best. Plenty of sun and fertilizer. **Bare Root**

**NEW** **Blushing Bride** *Size: Large* Flowers resemble a bride's bouquet with big broad outer petals that form a perfect platform for the frilly ball of inside petals. Very large flowers and plant. This one will become an instant focal point on patio or pond.

**NEW** **Dancing in Jade Tower** *Size: Small* An improved hybrid of Drunk in Jade Tower which was a top bloomer for Minnesotans last two years running with some people reporting as many as 7 blossoms at a time on one plant! It will grow to the size of the container so you can keep it smaller, or grow it slightly larger. Three different color blossoms depending on the day, first day blooms are rich pink, and by the third day, nearly pure white with pink along the edges. You can't go wrong with this one.

**NEW** **East Lake Pink(Donghu Honglian)** *Size: Medium-Large* Classic tulip lotus shape in a rich deep purple-red is a good bloomer. Very majestic with large seed pods that can be used in floral arrangements. Occasionally the petals will have vertical stripes which are unique and attractive. This one commands people to stop and take a second look

**NEW** **High Cotton** *Size: Large* Large blossoms of pure white perfection load this large lotus. The outer petals are wide and make a perfect plate to hold the more narrow, curled petals on the inside. Particularly bright gold stamen surrounds a lime green receptacle. The phrase "we are in High Cotton" refers to a fantastic crop, meaning everything is better than good. This lotus was named to honor all those hard-working men and women who paved the way for us today

**NEW** **Holy Fire(Shenghuo)** *Size: Medium-Large* Very easy to grow, reliable bloomer producing numerous flowers throughout the summer. The dark pink petals get lighter in the center as the flower ages, but keeps its beautiful pink color until the petals drop. 'Holy Fire' is correctly classified as a red lotus.

○ **Maggie Belle Slocum** *Size: Large* Classic pointed lotus flowers of deep fuchsia. Large and free-flowering.

○ **Mrs. Perry D. Slocum** *Size: Large* Very large flowers with pink/salmon coloring turning more creamy white as the days progress. Very free-flowering. Great for beginners.

**NEW**

○ **Perry's Super Star** *Size: Large* Very large flowers start out pink on the first day adding some yellow on the second day before turning a rich creamy white with violet-pink tips on the third day bloom. One of the easiest varieties to grow makes it great for beginners, but it needs a lot of space.

○ **Rice Paper** *Size: Small* Pure white with high petal count. Will grow to container size, so it can be kept smaller.

**NEW**

○ **Sing Birdie Sing** *Size: Micro* A classic lotus shape in a miniature plant perfect for deck or tabletop. The lovely white petals are rimmed in deep purple-pink. Considered a versicolor meaning 1<sup>st</sup> 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> day blooms will change in color.

**NEW**

○ **Tender Love (Lian Ai)** *Size: Small-Medium* Tender Love is a blooming machine! The small plant produces flowers continuously throughout the summer. The single-petal flowers are a deep red and are very large for a small lotus. We highly recommend this one for a novice grower.

**NEW**

○ **Titanic** *Size: Medium* Another superior bloomer with multiple blooms on a plant at one time throughout the entire summer. This one starts better warmer, so start on the deck, patio or in shallow water for best results. A dark red bud opens into a vibrant flower which holds its color well. This lotus will grow to the size of the pot.

○ **American Lotus** *Nelumbo lutea* *Size: Large* You will see this from a distance. Warm, yellow flowers and deep green leaves make a striking contrast. This lotus was propagated from a naturally growing native *nelumbo lutea* and chosen for its "bright happy yellow flowers". Because it is a natural variation of the native, it can be planted in natural waterways.

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## Waterlilies

### *Nymphaea odorata*

All waterlilies are sold as bare root tubers. Planting instructions are included: hanging basket planters are a good size, with plenty of heavy garden soil and fertilizer designed to be used under water. Tubers are priced by number of growing eyes and size of tuber relative to the size of the waterlily. We are also offering hardy versions of tropical crosses, known as Hardy ISG. These are rare waterlilies that bring new colors into the hardy market. **Hardy Bare Root Tubers \$5-\$30, Hardy ISG Tubers \$50**

- **Arc-en-ciel** *Size: Small-Medium* This has the most interesting pads of any hardy water lily in existence. Dark olive-green pads are speckled with splashes of cream, pink and yellow. Not only are the pads beautiful, the flowers are lovely too. Star shaped petals of soft pink fading to nearly white contrast beautifully with the splotchy pads.
- ⊕ **Black Princess** *Size: Medium* Such a deep red, that it almost appears black. A good bloomer with 5-6" blossoms. May fade in really hot sun and heat of the day, so keep in cooler water. Morning to mid-day sun is better in the heat of the summer. Maroon pads fade to green as they mature.
- ⊕ **Chromatella** *Size: Small* Very reliable bloomer, great for beginners. Never disappoints. Primrose yellow blossoms. Maroon speckles on green pads. Great bloomer even in less sun.
- **Chrysantha** *Size: Small* One of the easiest to grow of the small changeables. It has small copper-colored flowers with rounded petals that sit atop waxy, mottled pads. Great for a container.
- **Colorado** *Size: Large* One of the best northern pond bloomers. Multiple salmon-pink blossoms. Green pads with purple mottling. Fantastic bloomer in full sun. Needs space.
- **Firecrest** *Size: Medium* One of the fastest growing lilies. Pure pink cup-shaped flowers have fiery red-orange stamens with some fragrance and will hold their flowers above the water.
- ⊕ **James Brydon** *Size: Medium* An oldie but goody. This beautiful red hardy water lily has 4" to 6" peony-shaped blossoms that have a sweet apple scent. Lily pads are green. One of the few red hardy water lilies that will tolerate partial shade and still bloom.

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- **Joey Tomocik** *Size: Medium-Large* Named after the late director of Denver Botanical Gardens. It is the strongest yellow for Minnesota. Prolific bloomer stays open late in the day. Green and purple pads.
- **Little Sue** *Size: Small* Small, star shaped, fragrant flowers with uniquely tapered petals. The flowers open light coral and turn to a dark peach by the third day. The leaves are variegated and it is a prolific bloomer. Great for containers.
- **Manee Red** *Size: Medium* Thai-bred hybrid with brilliant red flowers that won't burn in the sun on a medium sized hardy waterlily.
- **Mangkala Ubol** *Size: Medium* Best Waterlily of 2004 by IWGS, prolific bloomer throughout the entire season of creamy yellow/peach petals. Deep green pads flecked with burgundy. A Thai hybrid not commonly available in the US, but it should be.
- **Mayla** *Size: Large* Brilliant fuchsia blossoms with high petal count. Needs large container and respite from full summer sun, but rewards aplenty with huge multi-petaled blooms.
- **Moon Dance** *Size: Large* Creamy white, large flowers with mottled lily pads. Flowers are held high above the water. A unique, large white waterlily that will bloom profusely.
- **Perry's Baby Red** *Size: Small* Large white double, star-shaped flowers that stand above the waters' surface are slightly scented. Very prolific bloomer with green lily pads. A good selection for any size pond.
- **Perry's Double White** *Size: Medium* Large white double, star-shaped flowers that stand above the waters' surface are slightly scented. Very prolific bloomer with green lily pads. A good selection for any size pond.
- **Perry's Fire Opal** *Size: Medium* Large fuchsia-pink double flowers with green lily pads. Perry's Fire Opal blooms are some of the nicest largest pink flowers. You will enjoy plenty of flowers with this hardy pink water lily.
- ⊕ **Pink Grapefruit** *Size: Medium* Pink to salmon blossoms, holds color well. Green pads with some purple flecks. Great bloomer and performs well in cooler MN ponds.

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### Waterlilies

#### *Nymphaea odorata*

- **Pink Sensation** *Size: Medium* An all-time favorite, clear pink with silver tips. The rich foliage color is the perfect complement to this variety that stays open later in the day than most.
- **Red Spider** *Size: Small-Medium* Super free-flowering with very unusual spikey petals resembling a spider. Light red/dark pink flowers are held above the water and will bloom well into the fall.
- **Sioux** *Size: Small* Changeable color blooms from yellow to apricot. The blooms are held just above the water and stay open later in the day. It is very free-flowering.
- **Starbright** *Size: Medium – Large* Very long star-shaped white flowers with subtle hint of pink. Unusual shape will stand out in the pond. Pads lightly flecked with creamy yellow.
- **Sulphurea Okeechobee** *Size: Small-Medium* Discovered in Lake Okeechobee as a natural cross between *N. odorata* and *N. Mexicana*. Only a few yellow hardy waterlilies have this unique pad coloration. Star shaped petals of light yellow with deep yellow stamens are a great addition for a small pond.
- ⊕ **Tetragona** *Size: Mini* The smallest of the small water lilies, sometimes referred to as a “pygmy”. Perfect for containers or shallow water. Adorably cute cup-shaped white flowers will occasionally produce light pink or purple with slight fragrance. Good bloomer.
- **Texas Dawn** *Size: Large* Plant in a large container and fertilize well, then stand back! Deep yellow double star-shaped blooms held high above the water with a lemony fragrance. One of the first to bloom in the spring. Green pads have burgundy freckles.
- **Wanvisa** *Size: Medium* Very unusual variable colors make each bloom from same plant a surprise. Pink, yellow, and salmon speckled and solid in each bloom. Gorgeous mottled pads. Vigorous grower.
- **Purple Fantasy** *Size: Medium* Hardy ISG cross between tropical and hardy to bring a gorgeous deep purple blossom with a bright yellow center. Flowers held high above the water. Green pads. Tropical colors and bloom profusion on a hardy tuber that is tested to -20F below 12” of ice.

○ **Tropic Star** *Size: Medium* Hardy ISG cross between tropical and hardy. Incredible fuchsia, pink and red outer petals with lighter bases. The flowers are held high above the water. Pads start mahogany and age to dark green. Tropical colors and bloom profusion on a hardy tuber that is tested to -20F below 12” of ice.

○ **Violicious** *Size: Medium* Hardy ISG cross between tropical and hardy. A great bloomer with a variable flower color between blueberry and amethyst but sometimes dark magenta. The flowers are 5” to 7” with lemon to apricot center and purple tipped stamens that show its tropical parentage. A light tropical scent. The plant has strong stems with flowers held high above water which should be great for cut flower arrangements. Expect a medium size plant with bronze or khaki pads that will mature to a dark glossy green. Tropical colors and bloom profusion on a hardy tuber that is tested to -20F below 12” of ice.

- ⊕ **Bog Lily** *Red Crinum ‘Menehune’* Delightful Hawaiian plant. Burgundy foliage holds color all season with spikey pink flowers that resemble fireworks. 12-24”h **3” pot \$6, jumbo pot \$16**

### Canna

All of these canna are considered “water canna” to be grown in damp soil or wet feet. They are great in containers or along the edge of the pond. Happiest with their crowns at or slightly above water level, but will tolerate a few inches below. They will do well in garden soil too, but keep them constantly moist.

- **Milkweed, Mexican** *Asclepias curassivica* A tropical milkweed with bright yellow/orange/red flowers resembling butterfly weed (asclepias), but blooms all summer and is a milkweed for monarch caterpillars. Good in containers and along pond edges. 2-3'h **4" pot \$4**
- ⊕ **Mosaic Plant** *Ludwigia Sedioides* Floating rosettes of leaves in an architectural pattern. Diamond-shaped leaves form perfect concentric circles on water's surface. A true conversation starter. **2 bare root stems \$7**
- ⊕ **Papyrus, Dwarf** *Cyperus haspan* Shortest of the papyrus with a fuller adorable pom on top of straight spiky stems. 12-18"h **3.5" pot \$6 jumbo pot \$14**

### Carnivorous Plants

- **Pitcher, Bug Bat** (*S. alata x psittacina*) x *minor* **Okee** Tall copper-colored pitchers with rounded arching reddish hoods. Has distinctive veining. Dark red fragrant flowers bloom mid-season. Z5-9 6-16"h

- ⊕ ● **Pitcher, Dixie Lace** *Sarracenia* (*S. leucophylla x alabamensis*) x (*S. leucophylla x purpurea*) Sturdy upright lacy red and white pitchers like smoking pipes having flat tops. Stays compact. Red fragrant flowers bloom mid-season. Z5-9 8-10"h
- ⊕ ● **Pitcher, Ewelina** *Sarracenia purpurea x venosa* Naturally occurring cultivar having pretty red-orange pitchers with dark red veins lasting 2 years. Very compact and hardy. Z4-9 4-8"h
- ⊕ **Pitcher, Flava Hybrid** *Sarracenia flava* x One of the largest pitchers and blooms amongst the sarracenia. Distinctive chartreuse green pitchers with occasional red veining. Showy yellow flowers bloom early before traps develop. Z6-10 12-32"h
- **Pitcher, Purple Native** *Sarracenia purpurea purpurea* The true MN native of our northern natural bogs. Low-growing hard, waxy traps of green/burgundy with purple veining hold for 2 years. Early-spring deep red flowers. Z2-8 4-8"h
- **Pitcher, Scarlet Belle** *Sarracenia leucophylla x psittacina* Dazzling red and white bell-shaped pitchers accented with white areoles, darkening to deep red-maroon in fall. Small dark red flowers early. Z6-10 4-8"h
- ⊕ ● **Pitcher, Yellow Jacket** *Sarracenia purpurea x rosea x flava* Golden yellow traps with ruffled margins. Copper hue in fall. Z4-9 4-8"h
